

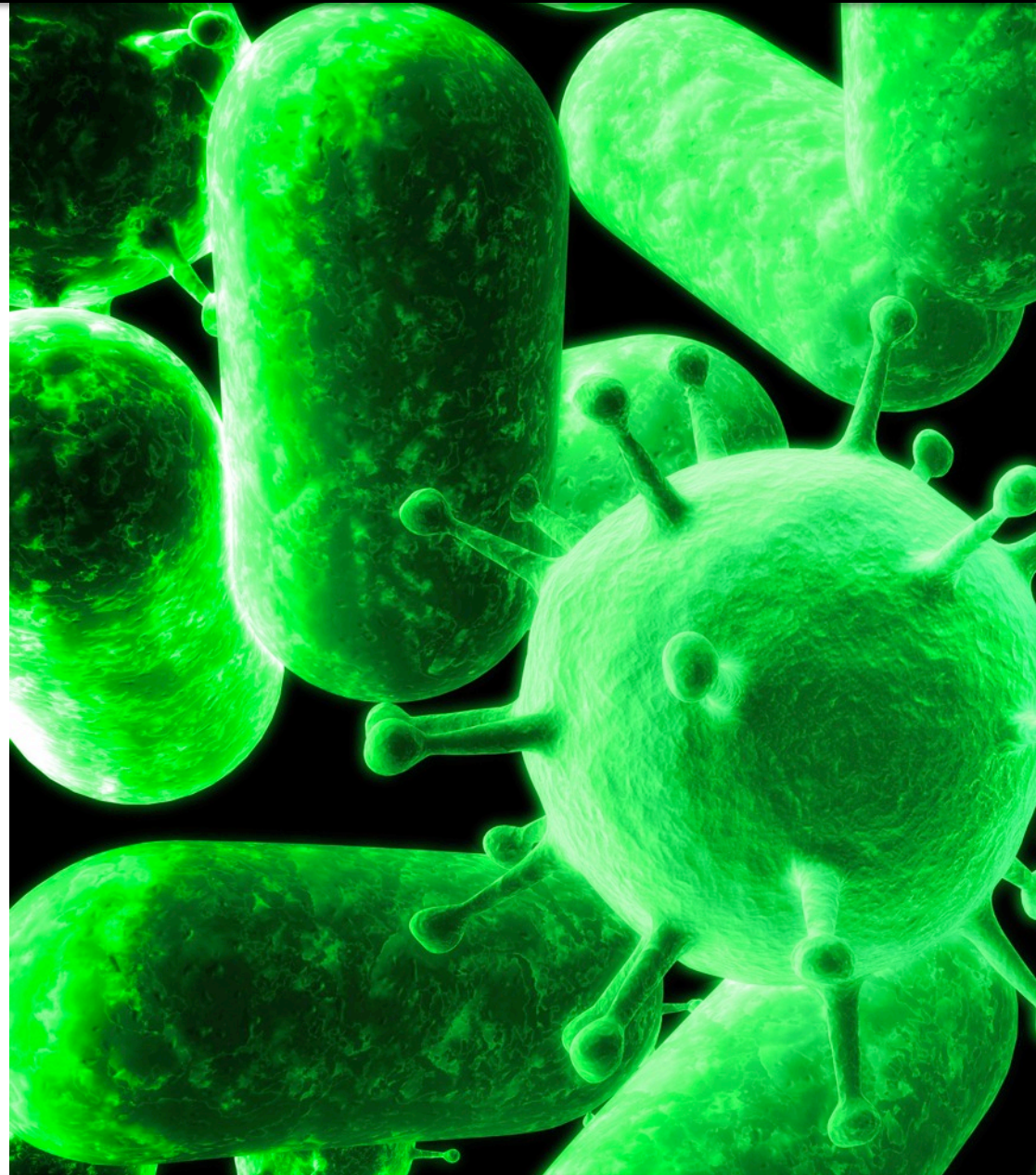

of infection control occurred in the 1860s when Joseph Lister used Carbolic Acid as an antiseptic in surgical procedures.

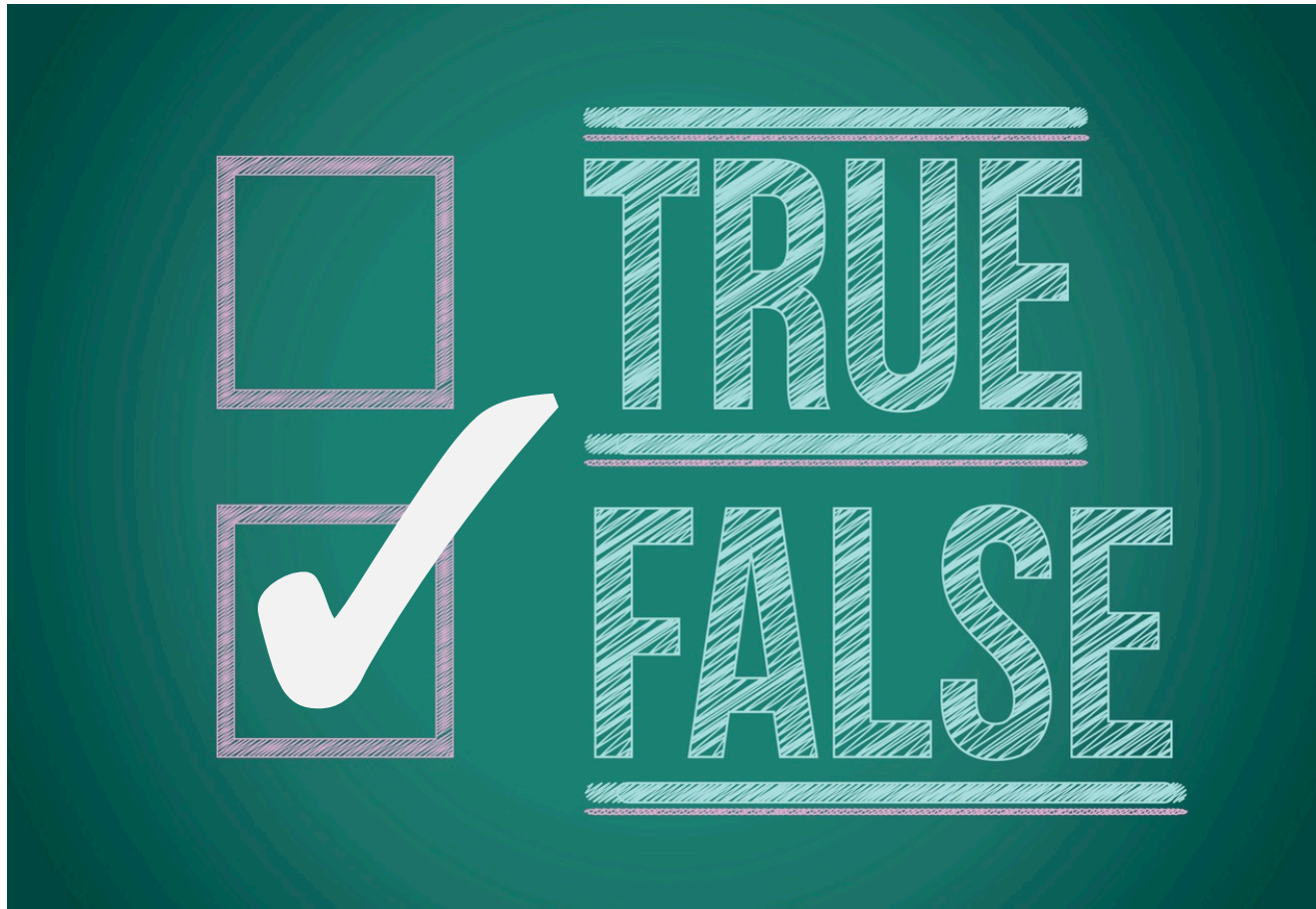

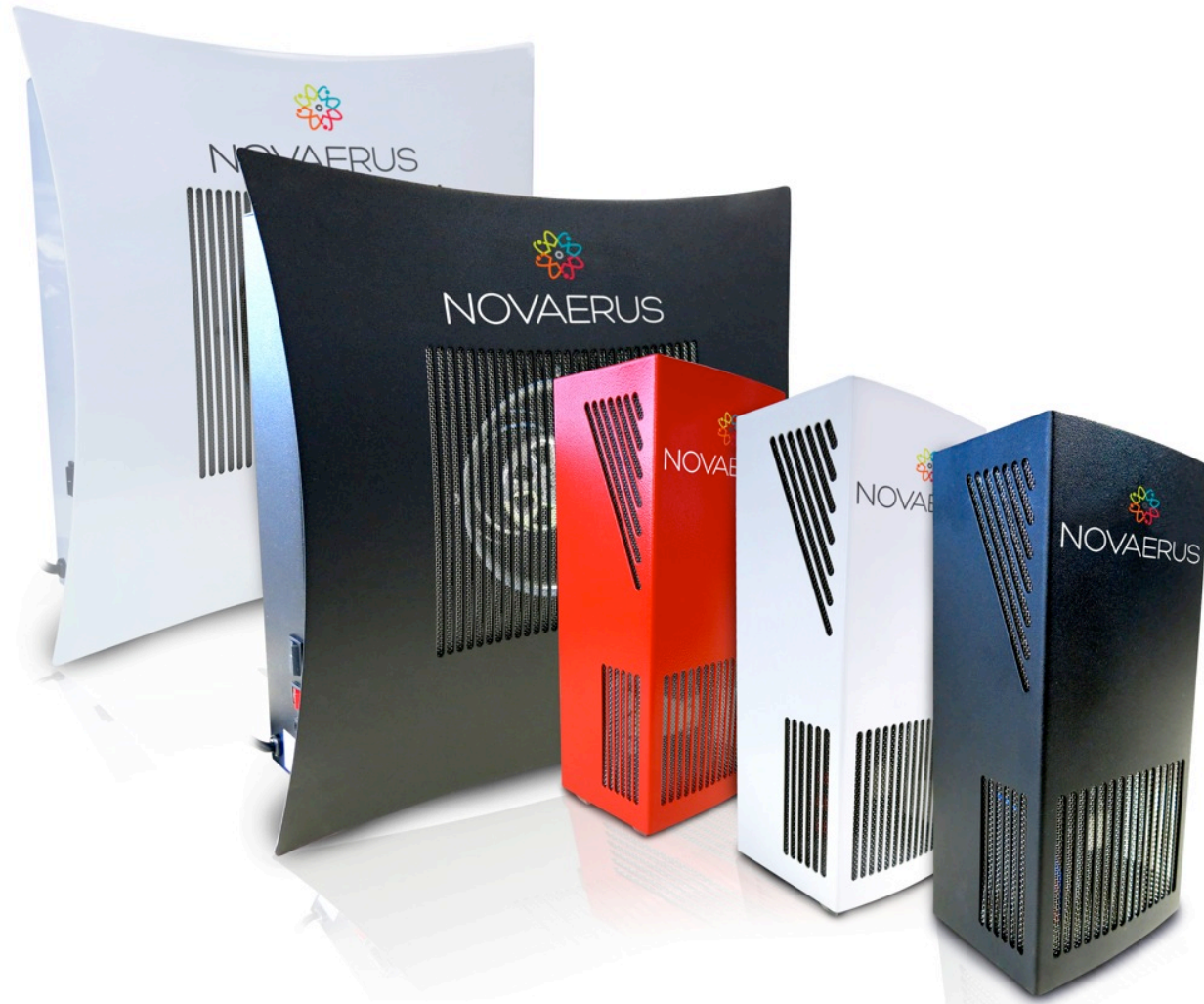

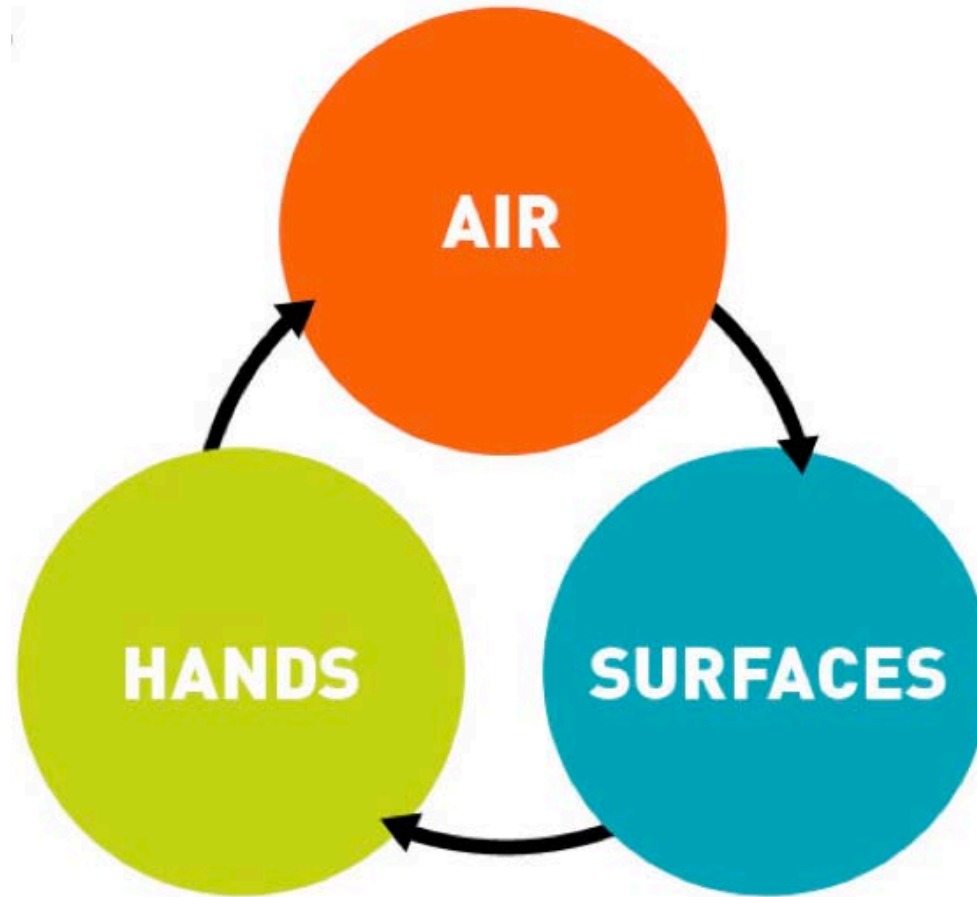
